

An Afternoon with Ian Evans

In January 2015, as part of a 4-man international expedition, Ian Evans joined an elite group of adventurers by becoming one of fewer than 400 who have skied from the coast of Antarctica to the South Pole. On what has been called "The hardest expedition on earth", the team took 44 days to cover the 950KMS to the South Pole at 9,300 feet above sea level. Join us as Ian recounts the adventure through images and video. Have the opportunity to check out Ian's polar gear and stay on for the Q&A session. All funds raised will be shared by the members of the Centre Wellington Refugee Network (cwrn.ca) -- which includes Project Welcome -- to support the our community-wide efforts to welcome up to three Syrian families into our community.

Wheels of Hope had another busy season collecting bikes. Our fourth container, in partnership with St. Bart's in Brampton shipped November

30th and should arrive in Namibia February 1st, 2016. Our Namibian partners have been busy not only delivering bikes but delivering food to the most vulnerable as the country is

experiencing a very severe drought.

As funding is always the most difficult part of our project, Wheels of Hope will not be collecting bikes presently and in 2016 will explore ways to support Bicycles for Humanity.

Milk Bag Mats will also cease for the present time. These mats were shipped along with the bikes to Namibia. In the New Year we will look at other organizations that might benefit from these mats. Until then, we have lots of milk bags and will not require any more until further notice. Thanks to all who donated.
