Elora UC: A budgeting and task group update

The Mission and Resources boards have been hard at work exploring ways we can deal with our budget short fall this year. Since our last update in May we have

- Been monitoring our finances monthly and ensuring that our spending is at or below budget
- Supported and received reports from our four task groups: Property, staffing, income and partnerships
- Held a retreat in early July to reflect and think about the suggestions from the four task groups
- Took immediate action on a number of recommendations (details to follow later this fall)
- Under the guidance of our property Task Group, we have started to work with EDGE from the United Church to better understand the opportunities around our building and property
- Will be looking at more specific and actionable recommendations at our September 12 meeting to formalize a tactical plan for a fall that we hope will bring us closer to a break-even point and then focus our efforts in 2018 on larger more strategic conversations.

We are grateful for the support, prayers and encouragement we have received from the congregation. Look for a more robust update in early October.
