Elora UC: An Update for the New Year

As you know, since our Annual Congregational Meeting in February the Mission and Resources Boards has been looking at ways to deal with our \$13,000 forecasted deficit. As we get ready for our Annual Congregational meeting on February 25, we wanted to update you on our progress.

First the very good news: thanks to your continued support of our congregation (including your financial support), a very successful Fish Fry, the hard work of staff, some hard decisions by the Boards and our revenue remaining consistent, our deficit for 2017 will be around \$1,000. This is something we can all be proud of! This means our short term 'crisis' is behind us for now. The longer and perhaps more difficult conversation about what is next, remains and that is where much of our focus has been this past year.

As you recall, we set up four task groups to explore specific topics that were impacting our future: income, staffing, property and partnerships. Each group has put a lot of time and energy into look at practical ways we can grow sustain our congregation financially and otherwise. Here is an update on each of the task groups:

The income task group had many good conversations about how to increase money coming into the church. Not surprisingly, there is no magic bullet to increasing revenue. In addition to maintaining our current givings, rentals were identified as a way to generate small amounts of income and build relationships with our community. Serious rental income won't happen without investment in the building and additional staffing. Based on what happens with our property and partnership conversions we may come back to this topic to explore more.

Staffing: This team explored our current staffing needs and after much reflection and discernment, made the difficult recommendation to the Boards to merge our treasurer and administrator roles. This resulted in significant short and long term savings. Also, rather than find a new music director, we used a variety of leaders. This decision was for many reasons, not just financial. It did, nonetheless, save us some money. Ideally there will be no additional staffing changes in 2018.

Property: The property team has engaged the support of EDGE a United Church ministry with experience in church property renewal and especially property evaluation. The goal of this process is to use the process that EDGE has developed to help us see and understand trends around our givings, attendance and our building. We are well on the way with the introductory phase of this process and have learned much already. This research might result in us having enough information to consider options or lead to a much longer (up to 2 year) process to consider future uses for our property.

Partnerships: This group is looking at partnership possibilities with other congregations including specific projects, areas of ministry, sharing staff, sharing buildings, amalgamation and ecumenical sharing of ministry. These conversations have been engaging and positive, but are just getting started. This year, we look forward to seeing what sort of traction might come from them.

In summary, we have accomplished a lot in 2017 thanks to the support and hard work of many. And while we have been able to deal with our immediate financial crisis, the fact remains that our givings, regular attendance and volunteer time continues to decrease. With the gift of a more stable foundation we can continue our conversations in 2018 about how best we can serve God, our community and one another. We look forward to this conversation with you at our AGM in February.
